In April our "Glamorous Occasion" celebration was certainly very glamorous and the delightful entertainment by the talented students of Adelaide College of the Arts confirmed and stimulated us in the IAF's aim of helping emerging young artists.

> In September, the Lord Mayor of Adelaide, Stephen Yarwood, gave a Civic Reception to honour the IAF's contribution to the cultural life of Adelaide and South Australia: it was a fine mark of respect for the IAF. Likewise the fact that the Artistic Directors of our major festivals came to us to present their programs:

Paul Grabowsky - Adelaide Festival Greg Clarke - Adelaide Fringe Jacinta Thomson - OzAsia Festival Anna Croutch - Writers' Week.

Over the year we have had the privilege of hearing authors talk about their ideas and their new books; visited the beautiful

historic gardens at St Vigeans; had the largest group booking for the Gala Opening Night of the fabulous Adelaide Cabaret Festival and enjoyed film nights with a wide variety of quality films. On behalf of the IAF members I congratulate and thank the chairs and committees responsible. namely Cheryl Appelkamp (Literary); Lynn Crosby & Mary Odlum (Film); Beverley Miller (Performing Arts) and Jessica Dames (Clare Regional Branch).

FROM THE TREASURER

As the incoming Treasurer for the IAF, I am pleased to report that we are continuing to have a profitable year. All our regular activities and special events held in the second half of 2011 have returned a profit. In particular, I would like to acknowledge the generous hospitality of Marjorie Fitz-Gerald OAM for hosting the IAF Christmas Party at her home which brought in a fantastic profit of \$1,229. Many thanks to all our members who attended – it was a very enjoyable evening!

For the period 1st July to 31st December 2011, we have an operating profit of \$10,739.64. \$4,765 of this is income from table bookings for the Book Lovers' Breakfast and will mostly go towards financing this event. Bookings are coming in quickly so I urge you not to delay but book your spot or table now as numbers are limited.

Sponsorship funds of \$2,500 have been gratefully received from Panurgem Pty Ltd. and Arts SA has contributed \$2,750 towards the hire of sun shade canopies for the 2012 Book Lovers' Breakfast.

We have met our commitment of \$3,250 to the IAF Creative Writing Scholarship and \$1,500 to the Adelaide Critics Circle Innovation in the Arts Award We have also donated \$1,000 to the 2011 Cabaret Fringe Festival Master Class and \$500 to the Urban Myth Theatre of Youth Inc. We will be able to continue our commitment to the 2012

Cabaret and Fringe Festivals and plan to support other projects now under review.

Our Term Deposit currently has a balance of \$16,472.62 having earned a further \$483.61 in interest since July. We will continue to keep these funds on deposit to maximise earnings as long as there is sufficient funds in our operating account.

Membership fees are a good source of revenue that assists us in meeting our aim of providing much needed support for emerging artists in SA. Thank you for joining or renewing your membership and please encourage your friends and families to join the IAF, attend the functions and enjoy the benefits of our organisation. We are always happy to accept donations from individuals or corporate bodies.

The mentorship will assist Alysha to explore her own unique voice as a playwright and text maker with multi-award-winning and internationally produced storyteller Caleb Lewis.

Since being introduced to the world of theatre and performance through Riverland Youth Theatre in 2004, Alysha has been recognized for both her artistic and leadership potential, including being the recipient of the 2011 South Australian Young Citizen of the Year Award.

Alysha is the proud parent of an 8 year old son, a theatre practitioner, community builder, dedicated volunteer and she is currently completing a Teaching/Arts degree.

On the road to unlocking her potential Alysha by her own admission, has been a high school dropout, teenage mum, single parent, waitress, artist, student, sewing machinist, blogger, dishwasher, community facilitator, speaker and many other things in between.

Alysha believes in the role of arts and cultural activities in building community morale and inspiration and her work and community involvement are evidence of this belief. Alysha is passionate about engaging young people with active citizenship and providing a voice and a bridge through which young people can do this. She is committed to social justice outcomes in everything she does and is actively involved in many levels of community building as a parent, employee, volunteer and passionate community member.

NEIL CURNOW AWARD

The 2012 winner of the Neil Curnow Award is: ELLONYE KENIRY



Adelaide College of the Arts graduate and emerging South Australian actor Ellonye Keniry is the winner of the 2011 Neil Curnow Award. Ellonye will use her \$10,000 prize towards tuition at the Sanford Meisner Centre in Los Angeles and the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London.

Ellonye will undertake five weeks of full-time study into the Meisner technique in LA, followed by an eight week professional Shakespeare acting workshop at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London. She plans to apply the knowledge and skills she develops overseas to her future Shakespearean roles.

"The Neil Curnow Award gives me the incredible opportunity to study at two of the most renowned theatrical institutions in the world," Ellonye says. "I find myself equally excited and terrified to know that soon, in LA, I will be working under one of Sanford Meisner's personal protégées - learning

the techniques Meisner taught at the school he founded. And going to London to study the English tradition of Shakespeare performance at the Royal Academy has been a dream of mine for as long as I can remember.

"Through these intense programs, I'm eager to bring to my performance of Shakespeare both the myriad physical and textual skills of the English tradition and the spontaneity and honest emotional responses invoked by the Meisner technique."

Since 2003, Ellonye has already performed a range of Shakespearean roles. With the Carnival Night Shakespeare Company, she has portrayed lady Macbeth, Juliet, Titania, Hermia and Gertrude (to name a just a few), while during her study at AC Arts, Ellonye played the characters Rivers and Lord Mayor in *Richard III* and the role of Queen Margaret in her self-devised *Crowned* – an adaptation of Shakespeare's *Henry VI* trilogy, a production that will also be staged during the 2012 Adelaide Fringe Festival.

The Neil Curnow Award is made possible through the generous bequest of the late Neil Curnow and is open to final-year students and graduates who have studied theatre direction, theatre lighting, acting or voice at the Flinders Drama Centre and TAFE SA's Adelaide College of the Arts. The Neil Curnow Award is administrated by the Independent Arts Foundation, in collaboration with the Helpmann Academy and Arts SA.

INNOVATION AWARD FOR CRITCS CIRCLE AWARDS

The winner of the Innovation Award for 2011 was Adam Synnott. Adam started in dance, graduating from the Adelaide Centre for the Arts in 2004. He performed locally with the Australian Dance Theatre and Leigh Warren and Dancers as well as with many other companies and performers.

He has toured and performed throughout Australia and to the USA and New Zealand. Most recently Adam undertook an Asia Link performing arts residency in Taiwan and performs in Chunky Move's *Mortal Engine*.

He has in recent years established himself as a sound designer and media artist. He has composed sound scores for projects, dance films and companies. As a media artist he has created interactive projection environments and visual sets.

Our award acknowledges his sound and visuals for *Side to One*, a dance piece by independent choreographers and performers Lisa Griffiths and Craig Bary. This featured the use of interactive sound and motion software to relate these effects to the dance in real time. Front and rear projection, looping, sophisticated lighting effects, and the beautiful dance, made this a performance to remember.

Adam was not present, as he was on a residency in Japan. His partner, Lisa Griffiths, accepted the award on his behalf.
