Ellie Cheesman \$1000 – To create a short film (about 10 mins) called ‘*Womenarche (instead of Menarche)*’. Exploring the menstrual experience and liberating the subject & young girls from shame. Ellie plans to use very aesthetically strong cinematography and editing, requiring a lot of focus and attention, to give respect to the subject matter.

Kyle Dolan \$1000 – To produce a 3-5 minute animated short film that will be submitted to film festivals around Australia and the UK. As an emerging filmmaker, this project aims to expand Kyle’s knowledge, experience and portfolio. Collaborating with an animator to make a short film will allow Kyle to further develop his voice as a producer and director, in order to gain more work in those fields in the future, as well as creating a network of other professionals.

Stephanie Jacyn \$1000 – The funds will go towards submission fees for several international and acclaimed film festivals of Stephanie’s short film “Mating Call” of which she is the writer, director and producer. Receiving funds for film festival entries via the IAF will allow Stephanie and her crew to proceed with necessary pick-ups without negatively impacting her crew’s ability to showcase their work or having to scale back their important festival strategy.

Lauren Murphy \$1000 – The grant will be used to purchase the equipment and materials such as clay and metal required to learn new skills such as welding, sandblasting etc. while undertaking the Helpmann Academy residency at George Street Studios. Lauren plans to expand her current practice, and further extend her knowledge through research and experimentation with new materials within the studio.

Gene Phoa \$1000 – Gene will use the grant to record ‘The Sweetest Smile’ which is the first single of his debut 12-song album ‘Young Love Days’ and explores the phenomenon of “love at first sight”. Representing the first step in the journey of meeting and falling “head over heels” for someone, this song will not only establish the project in general but it will establish the narrative that the next 11 songs will build upon.

Motus Collective \$5000 (Group Award) – To perform six shows of ‘*White Rhino*’ at the Botanic Gardens Hartsone & Kitney Amphi Theatre during the Adelaide Fringe Festival 2021. The IAF grant will be used to pay the dancers/collaborators a flat rate fee of \$1000 each, this will include rehearsal process over a 2 week time period.

Ida Sophia \$1000 – ‘*Regret*’, a 28 day solo, durational performance exhibited live at Floating Goose Studios in June, 2021. The IAF grant will fund a purpose built chair made by Furniture Designer Stephen Soeffky. The chair plays a central role in this performance. For 6 hours a day, for 28 consecutive days Ida Sophia will be seated in it.

Patrick Livesey \$1000 – ‘*Dirt*’ by Angus Cameron, a thriller set against the backdrop of the Chechen Queer Purges to be performed at Holden Street Theatre in 2021. The IAF grant will contribute to the fees of publicist Neil Ward, Neil is a highly reputable South Australian publicist whom Patrick has worked with on previous work, ‘*Gone Girls*’.

Daniel Clark (Ninti Media) \$1000 – ‘*Fighting to Farm*’ – a 60-minute documentary about the remarkable history of the Kangaroo Island Soldier Settlement Scheme. The film is part-funded by the History Trust of South Australia and has become even more poignant since the fires earlier this year (2020), which burnt the majority of the soldier settlers’ farms and original houses, The IAF grant will help support the creative output of two young filmmakers being mentored by Daniel, Isaac Doman (20) and Shakira Tremaine (15) in the production of the documentary, thereby making them paid members of the crew. The IAF also covered the travel costs (\$200) to bring Isaac to the Film Premiere hosted by IAF at the Trak Cine Centre on 9 November 2020.
